You're covered for preventive care.

Having Prevention Pays means preventive services like exams, cleanings, and x-rays are covered, even if you have reached your annual maximum benefit. We're also adding select periodontal (gum disease) cleanings to Prevention Pays to extend your benefits even more.

Because your plan now includes Prevention Pays, you'll also have more benefits available for treatment procedures like cavity fillings, crowns, and root canals if they're needed.



How does Prevention Pays work?

Our dental plans have what's called an "annual maximum benefit." The annual maximum benefit is the total dollar amount Delta Dental will pay for covered services during each plan year. Having our Prevention Pays feature means diagnostic and preventive dental services are not included in the calculation of your plan's annual maximum benefit.

Note: other details about your plan, like deductible, co-insurance, and frequency limits, if any, still apply. Check your specific plan for details.

Maximum value with Health *through* Oral Wellness®.

Including Prevention Pays means you will also be covered for any additional preventive care benefits you become eligible for through our Health *through* Oral Wellness program. Participating dentists will provide a risk assessment that unlocks added benefits for more preventive care if you're at high risk of tooth decay or gum disease.

Why prevention pays.

Oral health is an important part of overall health. Preventing tooth decay and gum disease is less expensive than treating them with more extensive procedures. Reducing gum disease is also connected to better overall health for those with conditions like diabetes, heart disease, pregnancy, and rheumatoid arthritis.
